Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony at Fortezza da Basso for the 89th MIDA – International Handicrafts Fair, from 25th April until May 1st

"Italian craftsmanship is a treasure we must preserve and promote," stated Adolfo Urso, Minister for Business and Made in Italy, in a written message.

Florence, April 27th 2025. MIDA, the 89th edition of the International Handicrafts Fair, continues at Fortezza da Basso until May 1st. In its first three days, it is experiencing a boom in visitors' numbers and enthusiastic public response.
